



A reflective pond bordered by stone and native plantings anchors the outdoor setting, creating a peaceful focal point just outside the studio. Inside, the space is warm and minimal, designed for both utility and meditation. A built-in bookshelf spans the back wall, with integrated lighting that casts a soft, ambient glow. Together, the architecture and environment form a cohesive sanctuary for stillness, inspiration, and productivity.

This backyard studio was inspired by traditional Japanese architecture and the calming principles of Zen design. Conceived as a retreat for focused work and quiet reflection, the structure features natural wood siding, a low, overhanging roofline, and sliding doors that open onto a small wrap-around porch. A stepping stone path leads to the studio entrance, encouraging mindful movement through the space.









1 INTERIOR ELEVATION - NORTH

3 INTERIOR ELEVATION - SOUTH 1/2" = 1'-0"




2 INTERIOR ELEVATION - EAST 1/2" = 1'-0"




4 INTERIOR ELEVATION - WEST 1/2" = 1'-0"



PROPOSED FLOOR PLAN

This modern fitness center was designed for mResidences, an apartment building located in Seattle's vibrant South Lake Union neighborhood. Originally an unconventional retail space, the area was re-imagined to meet the wellness needs of residents while reflecting the building's contemporary aesthetic. The redesign involved the removal of an existing storage space and staircase, which opened up the floor plan and created a brighter, more functional layout.

A portion of the original wall was retained to carve out a more secluded yoga and stretching zone, providing a sense of privacy within the open plan. This division allows for both high-energy workouts and restorative practices to coexist in a single, fluid space. The result is a thoughtfully designed fitness environment tailored for modern apartment living.







The model unit at True North Apartments in Seattle, WA was designed to embody the building's rustic, outdoorsy vibe while offering a modern and inviting living space. 
